Be curious and ask questions in order to learn more about the world we live in.

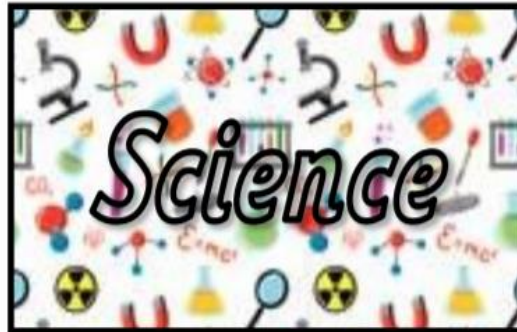
To be able to think independently and raise questions about working scientifically.
